Know ye, That John Hammon of Franklin County
Pennsylvania —
having deposited in the Treasury a certificate of the Register of the Land-office at Steubenville
whereby it appears that he has made full payment for lot or section
Number Thirty three, of Township Number Eleven, in
Range Number Eight, —

— of the lands directed to be sold at Steubenville
by the act of Congress, entitled "An act providing for the sale of the lands of the United
States in the territory north-west of the Ohio, and above the mouth of Kentucky river,"
and of the acts amendatory of the same, There is granted, by the United States, unto
the said John Hammon the — lot or section —
of land above described; To have and to hold the said — lot or
section — of land, with the appurtenances, unto the said John Hammon
his — heirs and assigns forever.
