Thank you to everyone that turn out for our July meeting featuring Mr. Richard Haldi talking about the Case Mansion. It was a full house and it was great to see everyone out and about. You never know what you are going to learn when you come to one of our monthly meetings. For some, they did not realize that the Case Masion property was part of Historic Plain Township until the City of Canton annexed the area. What a great story about the mansion and the people who lived there.

Wow, this summer is shaping up to be a very busy one. We are very grateful for the people who reach out to us and share their stories and items. In July, we were able to work through a large donation (145) of Middlebranch High School newspapers. We now have an example of each newspaper title published by the Plain Local high schools. Our earliest date is 1934. The first Middlebranch High School newspaper was published in 1931. There were two other surprises in this group of newspapers. First, two copies of the Middlebranch Grade School 6th grade newspaper. Second a 1935 and 1936 Senior issue. After looking at the Senior issues they actual turned out to be a precursor for the yearbook (1937 first yearbook.) What a great find. We will be sharing these newspapers with the GlenOak High School newspaper staff when school starts.

720 Sidestreet Market at Oakwood Square

Class Reunions and Soft Rollout

As PTHS continues to look for ways to engage our community and raise awareness, we look for opportunities to work with groups of people. One group has been on our radar to provide support for, and we did a soft rollout in July – Class Reunions. We have observed that every five years for a class reunion, a graduating class seems to start from scratch gathering a list of graduates and other information. PTHS has pondered how we can provide support to these groups. First, we rolled out on our website "In Memoriam" pages for each high school, showing by graduating class who was deceased. This provides a central location for this information which PTHS keeps anyway. By partnering with the reunion committees and the community, we can keep these lists up to date. This feature has attracted a lot attention and collaboration. An opportunity arose in July to work with Oakwood High School classes of 1972, 1973 and 1974. They were looking for the graduating photos of their classmates. Since we have the yearbooks, we were able to scan and provide the photos to the reunion committees. FYI, there were approximately 300 graduating seniors in each of

the three classes (900+ graduates.) The reunion committee inquired if we have a master list of graduates. As part of our archives, we do. This is information that we were given by the Plain Local Schools Foundation several years ago. So, we shared that information with them as well.

In July, we received from the Glenwood Class of 1962 their reunion committee archives. We have been working with them since the Glenwood book to move those items to our archives for safe keeping. We will accession and store the items for the class until they need them.

So, what does all this mean. PTHS can offer support to reunion committees in the following ways: storage for their reunion archives, list of graduates, and digital copies of senior photos. There are a few other services we will look at adding, but for right now this is what we are going to offer. All these options, help us to grow our archives and friends.

In addition to all the above, our website now offers not only "In Memoriam" page for each high school, but also, we are starting to roll out web pages for each high school. On our website you will find the master graduation lists for Middlebranch and Oakwood High School (all years.) The other two high school will be added as we double check the information we have. Check out the website under History – Schools. On the school's page, there is a listing of the schools in Historic Plain Township. If you click on any of the high school links, that will take you to a page that is dedicated to that school. These pages will contain information about the school (i.e., history, alma mater, fight song, etc.) On the Middlebranch and Oakwood High School pages, you will see links for each graduating class. Click on the link and information that we currently have about that class will appear. If you have information to share, please let us know. We are always looking for play programs, newspapers, commencement programs, etc.
