

Ohio 250 Project



In 2026, the United States of America will be celebrating its Semiquincentenial (say that ten times fast) or its 250th Birthday. There are a lot of events being planned at the Federal, State and Local levels. The focus of this project is having people tell their stories. PTHS is working with other local historical groups, universities, museums and others on a joint project, which is still in the planning stages, to highlight the history of Stark County. PTHS on its own is also in the

process of planning something. What PTHS is looking for now is to build a list of people, places, events, etc. that have a story to tell and stories we need to save. Yes, this is very broad and open to interpretation, but we need to start somewhere. You can help by letting Cindy Guest know of any stories your family may have or if you are interested in working on this project. Examples, how your family immigrated to the US, how a family business got started and grew, inventors, musicians, artists, what was farm life like, geological features, etc.

The State of Ohio will feature each month a different theme to promote: Jan - Ohio Originals and Firsts; Feb – Inventions, Innovations, Business & Work; Mar – Music & Entertainment; Apr – Transportation, Aviation, Automobiles & more; May – Arts & Culture; Jun – Natural Resources; Jul – Ohio Statewide Picnic & Homecoming; August – Ohio State Fair; Sep – Sports; Oct – Agriculture & Food; Nov – Veterans & First Responders; and Dec – Future Ohio. PTHS is going to use this framework to help guide the story telling we do.

Event Additions

We have added two events to our schedule this year. The first new event is Massillon Museum Genealogy Fair on Saturday, May 5th 11-3 pm. Last year this event was held at the Stark County Main Library Branch. We are excited to get out into the Massillon community and make new friends.

The second event added is the Hoover Park Festival on Sunday Jul 14th 10-2 pm. This will be at the Hoover Park outside, but we will be undercover. We are excited about adding this event to our schedule as this will be the first time attending for us.


