# **August Meeting**

Aug 19<sup>th</sup> – Scams and How to Avoid Them -Presented by the Stark County Sheriff's Dept

Our next adventure for the month, we opted to stay inside. In conjunction with Denise Evans, Zane Yohe, and The First Ladies Library and Museum, we shot an "Out and About" Facebook video that highlighted our collaboration. It was nice catching up with Stephanie from First Ladies Library to see how the exhibit was doing. They are getting a lot of positive response not just from the exhibits but also the interactive one room school display on the second floor. We will let you know when the Facebook video is posted.

The Avondale neighborhood is 100 years old this year. PTHS continues to meet with the home owner's association to come up with a plan to capture their history. A project like this, gives us the opportunity to work out in the community to help a neighborhood preserve its history. This was one of the outcomes we hoped that would happen when we worked with the Ridgewood neighborhood on updating their history. Avondale is made up of about 390 homes which are still in Plain Township today even though through the years there have been attempts to annex them. We are excited to see where this project takes us.

We generally lay low in July and August since it is so warm out, plus it gives us time to refuel for our fall push. We are also starting to plan for the 2025 season. September is going to be another busy month out in the community, so stay tuned.

### Virtual Gift Bags

Our virtual gift bag fundraiser is taking a break for August. This was a successful endeavor for us and allowed us to focus on funding our archival storage supplies. We are now in year three of transitioning our collections over. Our start on this project was funded by a grant from the Ohio Historical Records Advisory Board. Then we were able to leverage the archival supply donation from St. Jacob's Church in Cairo to preserve their church's 200 year+ history to help springboard us forward on our journey. This process of moving to archival storage solutions also has standardized the containers we use, which allows us to use our limited space more efficiently. We have also developed a migration path for our collections as they outgrow their current storage solution. Which from that, we have developed standardized storage labels. No wonder we have papercuts.

In September and October, we will be bringing back two favorite raffle prizes: mums (September) and Hillcrest Orchard Basket (October.) Proceeds from these raffles will go towards the six wreaths of service for the Henry Warstler Wreaths Across America event in
