Happy New Year!

Welcome to 2025 and the 20th Anniversary of the Plain Township Historical Society. We hope that your holidays were safe and enjoyable. We are looking forward to seeing everyone in February. We kick off the year with a look at the Fire Stations of Plain Township and also starting the celebration of the 50th Anniversary of the Plain Township Fire Department in February. Our wandering reporters, the Wanderer's are taking the month off to hibernate. They will be watching for what the groundhog has to say and hope for an early Spring to get back out and poke around.



<u>Dues Reminder</u> – Just a reminder that your 2025 due are due. If you are 90+ as of Jan 1, 2025, then your dues are free. It is important to get those in so you can continue to get updated information about what is going on at PTHS.



Our year is already off to a quick start. We have received three donations so far with a fourth one on its way (See recent donations below.) We are excited about another recent addition, the marriage certificate for John Wagner and Mandilla Warstler (Wearstler) who were married in 1879 at the St. Jacob's Church. This was the St. Jacob's Church in Cairo before the two churches split. We do not have any item like this from the St. Jacob's Church records we received last year. This is in great condition and we are looking forward to sharing this with the community. We have waited for four years to be able to add this to our collection. John Wagner (1855-1925) was the son of Jacob and Magdelena Wagner. Mandilla Warstler (1859-1934) was the daughter of Soloman H (1821-1901) and Mariah Snyder (1831-1908). They did not have any children.

The event calendar for 2025 is already filling up. We are partnering this year with the Massillon Library to present a couple of workshops on basic researching skills. The first one will be February 19th "How to Supercharge Your Search Criteria." This will be a presentation on tips and tricks to use search characters to help refine your search requests. This event is free and open to the public but you must RSVP through the Massillon Library website. Our goal with this event is to raise awareness about PTHS and to develop future researchers. We will follow that up in March with a collaboration with the Plain Library Branch with a workshop on "Trash or Treasure? My Family Does Not Want This Stuff!" This is again a free event . See

Since this is our 20th year, we are trying a couple of different events and venues to let people know we exist and get them interested in history.

This past December, we were the keynote speaker at the Avondale Homeowner's Association Christmas party at the La Pizzaeria. We gave a presentation on the history of the Avondale allotment which turned 100 in 2024. This event was the kick off for the information gathering phase of their history for a publication that is tentively scheduled for release in June 2026. This is going to be another exciting project for us.

Let us eat cake, which we will do at our February meeting which is officially the month PTHS was founded. We are also working on a special treat or two at our annual picnic in June as part of our 20th Anniversary celebration. The location for the picnic is changing again and we will be at Diamond Park. This location is easier to get in and out of, plus we can be inside and/or outside. The picnic will be held rain or shine unless there is a threat of severe weather. There is more coming for 2025 including the release of our 9th publication "The History of the Plain Township Fire Department." So stay tuned, check our website, newsletter and Facebook page for updates.

What's Next?

While we do not have a formal strategic plan, we do have goals and a vision for the organization. The Board of Directors is in the process of reviewing those goals and adjusting them to guide us for the future. We have accomplished a lot in 20 years and even just looking at where we have come from in the last five years it is amazing.

Archives – Our archives continue to grow and form stories about the history of our area. We have embarked on a plan to preserve artifacts in archival quality storage and maximize the storage space we have. This preservation started with a grant from the Ohio Local History Alliance for archival supplies and our first portable digital scanner. The Plain Township Fire Department repurposed some metal shelving for us to use for storage just in time for the arrival of the St. Jacob's Church in Cairo's records. We partnered with the church to make sure their records were stored properly in archival boxes. By standardizing the boxes we use, we can stretch our limited storage space to accommodate our expanding collection. As part of this upgrade of storage boxes, we also implemented a standardized labeling system for those boxes, making it easy to locate information. No more Post-It notes on the boxes. We will continue the process of converting our previous storage system into the new one. Another aspect of our archives, is we are fully committed to digitizing our collection. This allows our collection to be accessible for research purposes, provides documentation of what we have, and allows us to collect information that families want to share but want to keep. The naming convention used for boxed storage is the same for the digital information so they mirror each other. We now have five scanners thanks to several anonymous donors.

Financial – Five years ago just as COVID was taking a hold of our country, we launched our Endowment Campaign to raise \$10,000 to establish a fund with the Stark Community Foundation (thanks to the donor that pushed us over the top.) Ironically, we were able to launch that fund in February 2021 on our 16th Anniversary. In December 2024, we reached the \$50,000 milestone. While the Board never set an actual timeline to reach this goal, it was always on our radar. This milestone is significant because the yearly earnings that we are allowed to spend now will cover, if needed, our yearly fixed costs. This makes us financially stable. The endowment fund is a key component for our future viability. With the decreasing availability of grants and declining paid memberships, we need to find a stable income source.


